

Polish director Tadeusz Kantor, who died in 1990 at the age of 75, is widely recognized as one of the most important theatre artists of this century. Kantor's "Dead Class" is the best theater I've seen in all my life as a New Yorker. I saw it at LaMama, around 1991. Kantor had just died, and so the company left his director's chair empty on stage.
