

This is a really great book-- lots of lovely images and information, and an excellent resource for anyone who's obsessed with 1940s fashion. That being said, if I could've given the book a 4.5 star review, I would have (I just didn't have the heart to give it only 4 stars, too many beautiful images!). One thing I wished it had more of was pictures of average women in their day to day outfits rather than high fashion drawings to show what the average person was wearing every day. Also, I felt that this book didn't have nearly enough hats. Really now, more hats, please!

I love this book so much. It's a thick volume full of photos and drawings of hundreds of outfits from the 1940s. It includes high-fashion and everyday wear. The pages are smooth and high-quality, so the images are just beautiful. Perfect for period research or just gazing at and longing for a more fashionable time. A wonderful resource for those interested in fashion history or in having an encyclopedia of fashion insights for creative purposes.

As someone who is a huge fan of the 1940s, I was disappointed with this book. It's big and has great presentation, but it is also very limited in it's diversity. For example, there are just a few pages on swimwear, accessories, etc. There are more sketches than real photographs, which would have been nice. Maybe the author wasn't able to get permission to publish real photos, but I would have loved to see photos of more well known actresses, who of course, had impeccable taste. Even a store catalog from the 1940s would have been better, because it wouldn't have so many sketches. You can't see the proper detailing in those.
