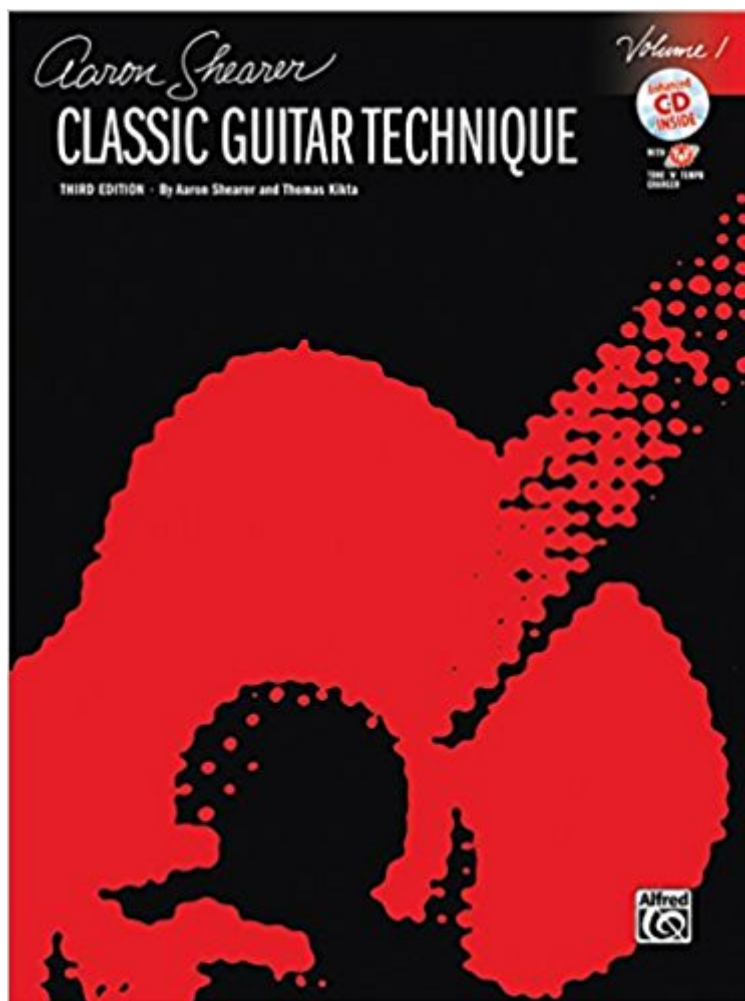

Caveat: my response actually refers to the prior edition, which I found used here for, like, a dollar. Based on the negative reviews of the new edition, that sounds like the way to go. What can I say about Aaron Shearer? At first glance, he couldn't seem more unlike the virtual guitar teacher I sought. (I am teaching myself). There he is, in his three piece suit, stiff and starched and speaking like a 1950s technical support manual-- SO dry and to the point. But as I began to play the exercises he wrote, and to follow his clear, concise, directions for practice, I started to get it. This is a method that is SERIOUS about guitar, and utterly devoted to helping you progress in the way that will lay

the best possible foundation. Moreover, the pieces are gorgeous. I mean, they're so much more beautiful than they would have to be for a beginner's guitar method book. For the most part, they are lovely enough that it is possible to completely lose oneself in practicing. As a singer songwriter who up until now was completely self taught, and had no sight reading abilities, this book has opened up a whole new world. Now that I've finished it, I can sight read in first position and have learned so much more about how to use my right hand. Even scales are exciting to me now, because I finally see that music theory is possible to learn. (I didn't have a lot of confidence in my ability to learn it before.) And while this book is not in any way condescending or babying, it is encouraging in the best way-- it gives you the right material at the right time to help you get better and better and see that you are capable of more than you thought. I've been playing guitar for ten years according completely to what sounded good to me by ear. But now, thanks to Aaron Shearer, a whole new vista of music is open to me. I also feel like I can learn to improvise, and have gone on to get other books about music theory and his book of scales. (I don't know if that one's as good as others of similar ilk, but at this point I feel like I really trust his method and like his tone, so I'm going with it.) Thanks Aaron Shearer! R.I.P.

I originally purchased an earlier version of this book in the early 1970's. I tried playing classical guitar back in my early 20's, but, alas, other projects got in the way. I decided to try again 40 years later, but I couldn't find my original book. On receiving this new copy, I learned that a CD is not included. I am totally loving revisiting an old desire to learn classical guitar through this book.

Interestingly enough, I have my Vol 2 book, but that was too advanced for my present "begin again" status. Even sections about how to sit, how to trim your nails, etc. are all helpful to me on restarting the "back to the basics" approach. The only advice I am presently NOT heeding in the book is to find a good instructor. But at my age, playing for simple enjoyment is good enough. And I am enjoying playing with the CD. The early tracks are slow enough that you can play without getting lost. Also, I found that my timing was not what it should be. I thought that the tracks were not in synch with the music in the book. If you run into this situation, you may need to count out loud to find out where YOU are off track...not the CD. Well worth every penny of my investment.

I purchased this book at the request of my Classic Guitar Teacher. So far it has been an unbelievably concise and knowledgeable book. Each section gives detailed descriptions and pictures on the technique and application of what is being studied. This book is fundamental to any beginning to intermediate classic guitarist. Even those who are self taught would be wise to purchase this book and polish their skills.
