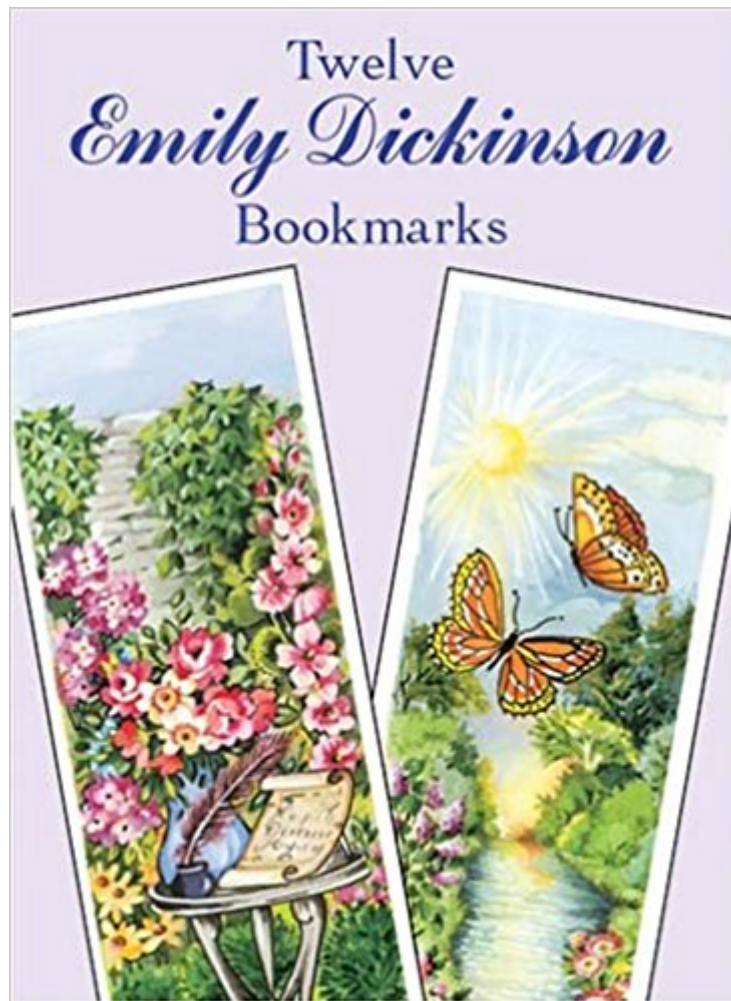

These bookmarks are so nice I had to buy a second set so I could laminate them and keep them protected forever. My first set were distributed among friends and relatives as little keepsakes that I included in cards and letters to them. The artwork is pretty and whimsical and they go along with the theme of the poem that is beautifully written on the back of the bookmark. If you like Emily Dickinson's poetry, then these bookmarks are a great way to save your place in a book. I highly recommend these!

These bookmarks were a great way for our library to promote National Poetry Month in April and thank our community residents for their patronage. They were perforated and separated easily; we added a label to the back that promoted our Friends of the Library group.

These made great gifts to some friends who are Emily Dickinson fans. Each glossy bookmark easily separates from the page and has a Dickinson poem on one side and an appropriate colorful illustration on the other. One of the recipients has bought more of them to use as giveaways at her meetings of the Emily Dickinson Society. Highly recommended!

These are thick card-board bookmarks with perforated edges and a glossy finish. They make a useful bookmark, and the art design on them is lovely. The whole book is nice as itself for a gift or giving out one or more at a time for various occasions. It's nice to send a little bookmark (like one from the booklet, as it has 12) along with a greeting card to friends and family; makes a nice gesture.

Honestly, I just purchased these to get my total to the 25.00 minimum for free s/h but I'm glad I did. As a long-time fan of Emily, I really appreciate the artwork and the careful selection of poems that are included. Even my four year old loves them and studies each picture and asks to have the poems read to him. I plan to purchase more of these as gifts for friends and bibliophiles like myself.

Before ordering these, please take into account the fact that the little book of bookmarks are perforated- you have to be very careful removing each one. Not a problem, however, the card stock is one that bends easily. Of course, the bookmarks really are beautiful, but again, you can tell from viewing them as separate, you can tell they are perforated. Since I can't use them one at a time in cards, I have decided to either just give the entire booklet as a gift, or carefully separate them one at a time and then laminate them! Too much work!

These 12 bookmarks are really nice for this price. They were actually thicker than I thought they would be, which I found a plus. Just be careful when you are cutting out each bookmark because it does come in a booklet, and you have to fold and tear each bookmark out, so just be patient and careful in order to avoid tearing a piece of the bookmark. But after you do that, they look lovely and ready to be placed inside a book!

These were a great hit at Open House for my students... I took them and carefully used the perforated edges to create individual bookmarks for my English students. After trimming the edges and running them through a laminator, now my AP English students have a bookmark to assist them

in their school work.
